*Robert Turnbull and Jane Rolph, with their 8 children, came to Canada from the parish of Yarrow, Selkirkshire, Scotland in August, 1831. Robert Turnbull drowned at the dock when the ship landed, apparently having gone in bathing.

His wife brought the eight children to relatives at Port Dover, Ontario, according to family history to "Old Man Waddel" who was an Uncle of theirs. Eventually the children grew up and settled in Norfolk County, Ontario.
